ORDER

The United States Sentencing Commission recently amended the sentencing guidelines for

the retroactivity of Amendment 782 in Appendix C to the Guidelines Manual. Retroactivity of the

amendment will become effective November 1, 2014, (with any order reducing the defendant's term

of imprisonment having an effective date of November 1, 2015, or later), unless Congress acts to

disapprove the amendment. To assist with the large number of defendants who could be affected

by the change, it is ordered that the Federal Public Defender's Office for the District of South

Carolina is appointed to represent defendants, with their consent, to review their files and to

determine if the amendment applies to them.

Furthermore, if the United States Probation Office for the District of South Carolina

identifies defendants who could be subject to the amendment, the Probation Office is authorized to

disclose information, including the presentence investigation report, to the Federal Public Defender

and to the United States Attorney.
