AMENDED STANDING ORDER

On April 2, 2020, this Court entered Standing Order 3:20-mc-00129-RBH authorizing the use of video teleconferencing and telephone conferencing, under certain circumstances and with the consent of the defendant, for various criminal case events during the course of the COVID-19 emergency. *See* The Cares Act, H.R. 748. That Order and any findings and authorizations are incorporated into this order.

Pursuant to Section 15002(b)(3)(A) of the CARES Act, I, as Chief Judge, have reviewed the authorization in Standing Order 3:20-mc-00129-RBH and have determined to extend it for an additional 90 days in all respects.

Pursuant to Section 15002(b)(3) of the legislation, this authorization will remain in effect for 90 days unless terminated earlier. If emergency conditions continue to exist 90 days from the entry of this order, I will review this authorization and determine whether to extend it.
