Summarize legal experience (including teaching) since admission to the bar, particularly in the past five years: Upon obtaining my JD degree, I clerked for one year under the Honorable William B. Traxler, Jr., during which time I observed a large number of trials and hearings, conducted research, and drafted opinions on issues in a wide variety of civil matters. After the clerkship ended in 1988, I began working at Ogletree Deakins, first as an associate and later as a partner/shareholder, where I remained until 2008. During my time at Ogletree, I worked on many different kinds of traditional labor and employment law matters in and before both state and federal courts and agencies, including: EEO charges and court cases (discrimination, harassment and retaliation on the basis of race, sex, age, disability, national origin, etc.); ERISA (denials of welfare benefits under group medical, LTD and severance plans); wrongful discharge and related claims (e.g., breach of contract, handbook, public policy, outrage, defamation, fraud, wage payment statute, whistleblower statutes); noncompete and trade secrets cases; union certification and decertification campaigns; collective bargaining; labor arbitrations; and union contract administration. I was the "first chair" attorney in many cases, including hearings, trials, and appeals at both the state and federal level. I also conducted training, labor and human resources audits, and gave out general employment advice on a daily basis.





SCHEDULE OF MEDIATOR'S FEES AND EXPENSES
(As of January 1, 2009)

Fees

Hourly Rate: The hourly rate charged depends on the number of parties involved, as follows:

| Number of Parties | Hourly Rate |
|--------------------------|--------------------|
| 2 | \$125 each |
| 3 | \$90 each |
| 4 | \$70 each |
| 5 or more | \$60 each |

Billable Time: Includes time spent in preparation (review of submittals by parties), pre-mediation planning sessions, conference calls, mediations sessions, post-mediation reports, and other activities required by the court or agreement of the parties.

Travel Time: No charge for time spent travelling within Greenville County. For matters in other counties, travel time is billed at one-half the hourly rate.

Administrative Charge: \$50 per party.

Minimum Charge: Two hours for conduct of mediation session (in addition to the administrative charge, any pre-mediation billable time or travel time as defined above, and actual expenses as defined below).

Cancellation Charge: No charge for cancellations more than 7 days before scheduled mediation date (except for administrative charge and any billable time already incurred). For cancellations 7 or less days before scheduled mediation date, there will be a cancellation charge of \$275 (in addition to the administrative charge, any pre-mediation billable time or travel time as defined above, and actual expenses as defined below). Cancellations on the day of the scheduled mediation are subject to the "minimum charge" defined above instead of the "cancellation charge."

Expenses

Mileage: No charge for travel within Greenville County. For travel to other counties, mileage expense will be billed at the then-applicable IRS rate.

Out of Pocket: Reasonable out of pocket expenses will be charged at the actual cost.

Special Discounts

New Customers: First time customers will receive a special discount on fees (not expenses) of 10% off the hourly rate (a "customer" is defined as the attorney representing a party, or a pro-se party). Second time customers will receive a special discount on fees of 5% off the hourly rate.

Volume Discounts: Special discounts may be negotiated for volume work.
